## Freedom of Information Request – FOI2024/01204

We are writing in response to your email received by Post Office Limited (“**Post Office**”) on 28 August, which has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (“**FOIA**”).

In your email you have requested the information shown verbatim in bold below:

**“Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following information:**

**- Any correspondence sent by Tony Blair to management of the Post Office. This should be taken to include any emails, letters and messages in any format, and refined to emails if necessary due to the cost/time limit. If easier to search for keywords please do so for "Horizon" and "Fujitsu".**

**Please limit the above searches to the period 1996 to 2001. If necessary, please refine this to 1999, and 1998 if possible without exceeding the cost/time limit.**

**In the event that you exercise an exemption on any of the above data, please could you supply me with the scheduled dates of the correspondence.**

**There is a clear legitimate public interest in this disclosure. Blair was Prime**

**Minister and Fujitsu's Horizon have been at the centre of prosecutions based on faulty data.”**

We can confirm that Post Office has been unable to locate any information within scope of your request.

For information, we carried out an electronic search of our emails and records using the keyword “Blair”, for the period of 1996-2001. However, after a manual review of the records located within this search, we were unable to find any information responsive to your request.
