Freedom of Information Request – FOI2024/01297

We are writing in response to your email received by Post Office Limited (“**Post Office**”) on 27 September, which has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (“**FOIA**”).

In your email you have requested the information shown verbatim in bold below:

“Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following information:

- Any correspondence sent by Ed Davey to management of the Post Office. This should be taken to include any emails, letters and messages in any format, and refined to emails if necessary due to the cost/time limit. If easier to search for keywords please do so for "Horizon" and "Fujitsu".

Please limit the above searches to the period 2010 to 2012. If necessary, please refine this to 2008 to 2010 if possible without exceeding the cost/time limit.

In the event that you exercise an exemption on any of the above data, please could you supply me with the scheduled dates of the correspondence.

There is a clear legitimate public interest in this disclosure. Ed Davey held a senior position and Fujitsu's Horizon have been at the centre of prosecutions based on faulty data.”

We can confirm that Post Office does hold the information you have requested, and this can be found in the attachment titled "FOI2024_1297 – Information In Scope_Redacted.pdf".

We have withheld names and personal data of junior staff members and third-party data subjects under sections 40(2) and 40(3A) of the FOIA, as the information constitutes personal data relating to other persons. These sections exempt personal information from disclosure if that information relates to someone other than the applicant, and if disclosure of that information would breach any of the data protection principles in Article 5(1) of the UK General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

We consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach the first data protection principle, which provides that personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly, and in a transparent manner. Disclosure would not constitute 'fair' processing of the personal data because as the information relates to junior members of staff who would not reasonably expect their personal data to be disclosed in relation to this request for information.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of this response, you do have a right to request an internal review. You can do this by writing to the address above within 40 working days of receipt of this response stating your reasons for your internal review request or alternatively, by emailing information.rights@postoffice.co.uk.

If, having requested an internal review by Post Office, you are still not satisfied with our response you also have a right of appeal to the Information Commissioner at:
