Freedom of Information Request – FOI2025/00406

We are writing in response to your email received by Post Office Limited (**"Post Office"**) on 13 June, which has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (**"FOIA"**).

In your email, you have requested the information shown verbatim in bold below:

"Former POL [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] gave evidence to the Post Office Inquiry last year and they are still on the payroll of the company.

I would like to know what are their active roles, if any?

What are the dates of their last work-related emails?

Do they have any direct reports?

Can POL provide any context why [REDACTED] is still employed by the company given it has a new [REDACTED] and why is [REDACTED], tainted by the Horizon IT scandal, also still employed."

We consider that your first three questions are for recorded information and can confirm that Post Office does hold information within scope.

Whilst we can confirm that both individuals are no longer Post Office employees, we have decided that all other information should be withheld under sections 40(2) and 40(3A) of the FOIA as the information constitutes personal data relating to other persons. These sections exempt personal information from disclosure if that information relates to someone other than the applicant, and if disclosure of that information would breach any of the data protection principles in Article 5(1) of the UK General Data Protection Regulation ("**GDPR**").

We consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach the first data protection principle, which provides that personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly, and in a transparent manner. Disclosure would not constitute 'fair' processing of the personal data because the information is sensitive and relates to past and/or current Post Office employees that would not reasonably expect this information to be disclosed in relation to this FOIA request.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of this response, you do have a right to request an internal review. You can do this by writing to the address above within 40 working days of receipt of this response stating your reasons for your internal review request or alternatively, by emailing information.rights@postoffice.co.uk.

If, having requested an internal review by Post Office, you are still not satisfied with our response you also have a right of appeal to the Information Commissioner at:
