Freedom of Information Request – FOI2024/00743

We are writing in response to your email received by Post Office Limited (“**Post Office**”) on 4 April, which has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (“**FOIA**”).

In your email you have requested the information shown verbatim in bold below:

“Under the Freedom of Information please could you send me the content of a recorded delivery letter addressed to [Redacted] sent on 21 August 1990”

We can confirm that Post Office does not hold the information you have requested.

We carried out a search of our records against the names [Redacted] and [Redacted]. The focus of our second search was to ensure the correct spelling of [Redacted], which may have been the focus of your information request.

The outcome of these searches resulted in only six hits. Each of these hits were reviewed, and no data was held regarding a recorded delivery letter addressed to [Redacted] sent on 21st August 1990.

It is worth noting that Post Office separated from Royal Mail on 1 April 2012 and, therefore, we do not have access to information held by Royal Mail.
