We are writing in response to your email received by Post Office Limited ("**Post Office**") on 29 May, which has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("**FOIA**"). We do apologise for the delay in responding to your request.

In your email you have requested the information shown verbatim in bold below:

Re : Sub-post office

"1. How many complaints you have received about this branch in the last 2 years from the date of this request. I know it is at least one as I have complained.

2. If any security concerns have ever been raised about this branch in relation to the fact that the shop and post office area are connected with no intervening door.

In relation to point 2 I request that your security section are informed. I will of course use this as proof that the Post Office knew if a security incident occurs in the future."

We can confirm that Post Office does hold the information you have requested.

"1. How many complaints you have received about this branch in the last 2 years from the date of this request. I know it is at least one as I have complained.

We have received less than 5 complaints in the last two years.

2. If any security concerns have ever been raised about this branch in relation to the fact that the shop and post office area are connected with no intervening door.

We can confirm no security concerns have been raised about the branch, specifically in relation to the shop and Post Office area being connected with no intervening door.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of this response, you do have a right to request an internal review.
